## NOTICE OF INTENTION TO AMEND THE SCHEDULE to THE KWAZULU-NATAL HERITAGE ACT, (4 of 2008)

The Council of Amafa aKwaZulu-Natali hereby gives notice in terms of Section 38(8)(a) of the KwaZulu Natal Heritage Act, Act No. 4 of 2008, of its intention to amend the Schedule to the said Act by the withdrawal of the following from the list of specially protected sites:

**BACKGROUND:** The temple was built in 1916 and was amalgamated with the Hindu Thirukoolam that was instituted in November 1910 by Tamil residents of Ladysmith for the promotion of Tamil and English education. It was declared a "National Monument" on the 11 February 1990. The structures on the site consist of a Sikhara that is hidden from view by the veranda and hall in front of it, which were added at a later stage, as well as an outbuilding, awning and boundary wall. The area in which the Temple is situated was flooded several times over the 100 years of its existence leading to the community it served vacating the area in favour of higher ground and the establishment of another Shree Ganesha Temple in the new suburb. The Temple has been deconsecrated and the deities have been removed to the new Temple. The temple now stands in a degraded area and has been vandalized to the point that conservation is no longer viable.
